

**VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT**  
**November 6, 2018, General Election**  
**Town of Springdale**

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on **Tuesday, November 6, 2018**, for the Partisan Primary Election may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. Citizen,

- who will be 18 years of age or older on election day, and
- who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 days before the election.
- The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot.

**You can request AN ABSENTEE BALLOT:**

- Through MyVote: <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/VoteAbsentee>; or,
- By WRITING (email is acceptable) your municipal clerk.

Your written request must list:

- Your voting address within the municipality where you are eligible to vote,
- The address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different,
- And your signature.
- You can also go to the clerk's office, and vote an absentee ballot. Springdale will have staff in the office to accommodate early voting at the following times:
  - Tuesdays, from 11 AM until 3 PM
  - Saturday, October 20 from 9 AM until Noon
  - Saturday, October 27 from 9 AM until Noon
  - Monday, October 29, from Noon until 7 PM

No matter how you make the request, YOU MUST ALSO PROVIDE YOUR PHOTO ID.

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is: 5 p.m. on the fifth day before the election, November 1, 2018.

*Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk.*

- The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is: Tuesday, September 18, 2018.
- The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is: by 4 PM, Friday, November 2, 2018
- No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election.
- The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close – 8 PM on November 6, 2018.
- Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.
