TRASH/RECYCLING: Town and Country Sanitation – 800-626-1915 and 375-5856. Roadside trash pickup and mandatory recycling is completed on Friday of each week. **The 2017 holidays which move the pickup to Saturday are: Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and 2018 New Year's Day.** The basic weekly service includes disposal of up to four bags of garbage/refuse, **each weighing 35 pounds or less**, and the collection of unlimited recyclable materials. The unlimited recyclables are sorted by hand and **MUST** be placed in the proper condition at the road. Please do not commingle trash and recyclables in plastic bags or garbage cans. The recycling instructions and locations to take recyclables are posted on the town website, www.townofspringdale.org. A handout may be obtained from the town clerk. There is a comprehensive set of guidelines in this newsletter distinguishing between recyclables and trash. **All items must be placed at the road by 6:30 a.m.** Town and Country Sanitation will collect additional garbage, appliances, bedding, electronics, furniture, etc. upon request, for a fee. **Spring Clean-up is Saturday, June 10, 2017.**

TOWN OF SPRINGDALE CLEANUP (TRASH ONLY) IS SATURDAY, JUNE 10, 2017

Friday, June 9, 2017, is your regularly scheduled trash/recycling pickup.

To make this cleanup successful, please follow these general guidelines. Place all acceptable trash at the road by 6:30 a.m. All trash must be placed in trash cans or bags or tied into 4' x2' bundles. No container or bundle may exceed 35#. No loose trash or trash in cardboard boxes will be accepted. If you have any questions, call Town and Country Sanitation at 800-626-1915 or 375-5856.

General Guidelines for Weekly Service

- Trash or recyclables in 55 gallon drums & barrels will not be emptied because they exceed the 35# weight limit.
- Trash and recyclables may not be comingled. They must be placed in separate containers.
- Place all materials at curbside by 6:30 a.m. because the trucks may change routes and pick up times may change.
- Pickup will take place on a Saturday when a holiday is during the week. The 2017 holidays affecting pickup are Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and 2018 New Year's Day.
- Please consult the town website or call 1-800-626-1915 for specific information about a recyclable or trash item.
- Additional recycling bins are available from the town hall for \$9 per bin.

Springdale Committee on Utilities in the Rural Environment, SCURE

The Springdale Committee on Utilities in the Rural Environment (SCURE) continues to engage in the process that may lead to the siting of a 345-kilovolt power line in southern Wisconsin.

American Transmission Company, the utility that would construct the power line has identified a corridor through the Town of Springdale as one through which the power line could run. The company has said that it expects to announce its preliminary routes, the specific location of the route within the corridor, for the power line in the spring or early summer.

In early January, the committee also submitted comments to the Rural Utilities Service, one of the federal agencies evaluating the potential environmental impact of the power line. These comments were designed to ensure that the RUS understood the town's general plan for land use, which would be upset by the construction of a power line. The comments also highlighted the general environmental characteristics of the town the committee suggested that the RUS keep in mind during its environmental assessment. The RUS is expected to issue its draft environmental impact statement this fall. The committee will comment on the draft statement.

The committee also has been working to reach out to other groups working on the power line issue. Committee members have engaged with a wide variety of organizations, including the schools, the village of Mount Horeb and other groups like the Driftless Area Land Conservancy. Look for announcements about other ways in which you can engage in this issue and opportunities the committee and other organizations create to help the community learn more about the power line and its potential impact.

Do You Have a Driveway Longer Than 1000 Feet?

Mt. Horeb Fire Department would like to identify rural driveways longer than 1000 ft. and install a blue oval marker on the fire number pole at the road. In the case of a fire, first arriving fire engines only carry 1000 ft. of water supply hose. The marker at the road would allow the fire department to plan for additional water supplies.
